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ABOUT THE FILM

HUMAN RESOURCES is a modern mystery/horror film that takes place entirely within the walls of an eerie hardware store. It centers around Sam Coleman, an anxious young employee at Brooke's Hardware Store who finds himself entangled in a terrifying mystery at the heart of the business. The story depicts the often dreadful experience of working an isolated retail job and elevates it to a sinister and nightmarish level.

SYNOPSIS

After starting a job at a creepy hardware store, Sam Coleman uncovers a shocking mystery involving a missing employee. With the help of Sarah, a cynical coworker, Sam plunges into the dark corners of the store and is forced to confront the terrifying forces that lurk just behind the walls.




TARGET AUDIENCE

THIS MOVIE is primarily aimed at younger viewers (16 - 35) and fans of horror, thriller and mystery movies. But anyone who has experienced working a mindless retail job can relate to the journey of our main character, Sam Coleman. The underdog story of facing anxiety and battling forces bigger than yourself is a also universal theme that will strike a chord with a wide audience.

MARKETING OPPORTUNTIES

OUR FILM has several unique selling points that will set it apart from competition. It was created by a team of young filmmakers, led by a 19 year old director! It is also an entirely original story written by two brothers, based on a premise to which most people can relate. It has the same similar progressive horror themes as recent successful thriller/horror movies like *Get Out* (2017) and *10 Cloverfield Lane* (2016), as well as a strong mystery element similar to recent boxoffice winners like *Knives Out* (2019).



BACKSTORY

HUMAN RESOURCES began as a pitch from producer/cowriter Evan Swope to his brother, director Braden Swope. Evan saw potential in making a horror movie based in the mundane, lonely world of a low-level retail job. Immediately upon hearing the pitch, Braden was absolutely determined to make it into a reality. He knew that the cold, eerie feeling of working a long shift at a retail job would be the perfect setting for a unique horror movie. He envisioned a story about fear, self-confidence, and battling your demons. After months of working on a 120-page screenplay, the Swope brothers were ready to start building a crew. Braden, who had attended the Orange County School of the Arts' (OCSA) Film and Television program for high school, recruited former classmates and friends, selling them on his vision for Human Resources.

BACKSTORY CONTINUED...

Kendall Huff, who had also attended OCSA, joined as the film's producer, and she and Braden worked together to form an almost all-volunteer cast and crew of 150+ people. They also worked to secure locations for the film, eventually finding *four different retail stores* to let them shoot during business hours! Braden, Kendall and Evan worked tirelessly to raise money, audition hundreds of actors, and secure *everything* that was needed to film a feature.

Every department worked to the last minute to tackle something so colossal. The cast rehearsed, props were created, camera tests were completed, and then finally, in the summer of 2019, *Human Resources* was filmed over twenty-two days. Braden then worked nonstop to edit and complete the film during COVID-19 lockdowns: working with composers, sound designers, colorists - and doing many other jobs himself - to turn the footage into a finished feature film.







BRADEN SWOPE

DIRECTOR/PRODUCER/WRITER/EDITOR

Braden Swope is a persistent and inspired filmmaker born and raised in Southern California, who has fallen in love with every role underneath the umbrella of filmmaking. Attending the Orange County School of the Arts' fouryear Film & TV program for high school offered him a platform to direct almost a dozen shorts, and fully solidified his desire to work in film for the rest of his career. While directing and editing stand strongly at the forefront of his interests, working on Human Resources gave him the opportunity to diversify his skill set by holding a direct role in every step of production. Going forward into the industry, he has high hopes to continue directing larger-than-life feature films about the bizarre and offbeat characters that he and his brother Evan have been creating since childhood.





KENDALL HUFF


PRODUCER




Tim Misuradze as




Michael Kammerer as






AFTER 3 YEARS OF PRODUCTION...
